Eligibility Policy:

Students are eligible to participate in the Ardrossan High School Graduation Exercises provided they meet the criteria for the Alberta Education High School Diploma by the end of April.

Students who fail to meet the criteria for the High School Diploma after the deadline will have their eligibility for participation in the Senior Class Exercises reviewed by school administration.

Communication Process:

1. Grade 12's and parents attend an information meeting at the fall Parent-Teacher-Student interviews.
2. All Grade 12 students receive a letter indicating grad requirements and their progress to date.
3. The first Grad list is compiled in November.
4. Students complete and check course mark inquiries and note any inaccuracies /discrepancies.
5. Counselors meet with individual students who are at risk and communicate with parents/guardians.
6. Accuracy of student status is checked and the Grad list is updated after first semester marks.
7. The Grad list will be updated again in spring. Students must be on track to pass all courses.
8. All Grade 12 students receive a second letter indicating their progress to date.
9. The final grad list will be updated before ticket sales draw in late May.

Graduation Eligibility:

1. Students must earn a minimum of 100 credits including the following:
 - English 30-1 or 30-2
 - Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2
 - 10 30-level credits other than English and Social Studies
 - Math at the grades 10 and 11 levels (10 credits)
 - Science at the grades 10 and 11 levels (10 credits)
 - CALM (3 credits)
 - Physical Education 10 (3 credits)
 - 10 credits in CTS, Fine Arts, Second Languages, Phys. Ed. 20 or 30, K&E, RAP
2. Grade 12 student must carry a minimum of 15 credits per semester.
3. Students enrolled in Distance Learning, NextStep Outreach or CTS courses must complete 75% of their coursework by end of April.
3. All school fees must be paid.

Valedictorian

The grade 12 student with the highest school-awarded average on April 30th, 2018 in the following subjects will be chosen as valedictorian:

1. English 30-1
2. At least three of the following:
 - Math 30-1
 - Mathematics 31
 - Biology 30
 - Chemistry 30
 - Physics 30
 - Science 30
 - Social Studies 30-1
 - French Language Arts 30-1
3. Any one course with a minimum five credit value at the Grade 12 level (3000 or 6000 series) including those listed above and combined advanced CTS courses.

Elk Island Public Schools Policy Admin Procedure 145 states:

1. Alcohol shall not be served or consumed in any EIPS facility or at any EIPS function when students/children are involved or on the premises.
2. Alcohol shall not be consumed or used in any manner at any school sponsored graduation ceremony or activity.

Dress:

While the evening may inspire formal dress, it is not necessary to have a floor length formal gown or tuxedo. A dinner dress, suit or slacks are appropriate.

Tickets:

Tickets will go on sale in early June. Students will participate in a lottery towards the end of May to eliminate line-ups and determine which day grads come to do their table selection and purchasing tickets.

Each person who is planning to attend the banquet, including the graduating student, must purchase a ticket. All school fees and the grad fee must also be paid prior to purchasing tickets.

Costs

There is a \$60 (including GST) grad fee (collected with school fees). There is no fundraising for grad and the fee does not cover admission to the banquet and dance. The fee covers only the following:-

- Caps and Gowns
- Invitations, mail-outs
- Grad Mementoes Package (Composite, Folders)
- Printing and Paper costs
- Grad slide show.

The grad ticket cost will be approximately \$75 per person and is on a cost recovery basis. Each person attending the banquet, including the graduating student must purchase a ticket. The ticket price includes the following:-

- Catering
- Facility rental
- Tablecloths
- Decorations
- Ticket Printing
- Dance
- Sound systems, audio visual and lighting equipment
- Set up, take down and cleaning.

There is also seating available for guests who cannot attend the dinner for approximately \$25 per ticket. These will be sold at the time of the banquet tickets and up to a few days before graduation.

More information on purchasing grade tickets along with costs will follow in May.

Grad photos have been booked for February 12 - 15th, 2018. Retakes are scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, March 19th and 20th, 2018. Grad photo appointment bookings must be made online at www.iconexp.com. Bookings can only be made after the Christmas break. At this time you will be go to the "BOOK NOW" tab at top of page to make your booking. You will then "Select the Event: Icon Studio Portraits". We encourage each of you to make an appointment with one of the counsellors to deal with your own special situation. We also encourage you to make use of the material that is available in Student Services. Most application forms for admission and scholarships are available through the Internet.

Watch the bulletin boards in the Student Services area, check the daily announcements, the monthly Bison Tracks and the school's web site for important information regarding admission deadlines, scholarships, new programs, and other information related to post-secondary education.

WEB RESOURCES FOR PLANNING POST SECONDARY LEARNING

The **ALIS** (Alberta Learning Information Services) website is an excellent source of information for planning beyond high school. Some of the valuable parts of ALIS include the following:

APPLICATION TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN THE EDMONTON AREA

Most post-secondary institutions in the province are using the online application system ApplyAlberta. This portal allows students to apply to multiple post-secondary institutions. Students create an account with a secure login. For more information and to create an account, visit www.applyalberta.ca

It is a good idea to apply early as many programs work on a “first qualified, first served” basis. Students are encouraged to consider applying to more than one institution to increase chances of acceptance in at least one program.

ADMISSION TO POST-SECONDARY PROGRAMS

All post-secondary institutions specify minimum admission requirements for each of the programs that are listed on their web sites. If a particular program is over-subscribed, usually students with the highest marks are selected and entrance requirements can go up significantly. It is important for you to find out the exact requirements for the program you want to enter.

STUDENT FOR A DAY

Most post-secondary institutions in the Edmonton offer Student for a Day programs where you can meet with a program advisor, attend a class in an area that interests you, take a campus tour and have lunch with a mentor.

TRANSCRIPTS

All post-secondary institutions, as well as sponsors of scholarships and bursaries require transcripts. Check to see if they will accept a school certified copy of your marks (available from one of the counselors) or if they want an official transcript issued from Alberta Education. If you apply through ApplyAlberta, your transcript will be automatically sent to participating institutions. Student requests for Alberta Official Transcripts of High School Achievement can be made online using myPass. <https://mypass.alberta.ca/>

DIPLOMA EXAM REWRITES

Students can register and pay for diploma rewrites through their myPass account. The diploma exam rewrite fee is \$26.25 each payable to the Provincial Treasurer. Deadline to apply for the January diplomas is early November. Deadline to apply for the June diplomas is early April.

POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS AT A GLANCE

THE UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA

- ❖ The University of Alberta will do campus tours by appointment
- ❖ Applications opened October 1
- ❖ March 1st deadline for most programs
- ❖ New for 2017-2018:
 - Specific required averages will not be published.
 - Admission offers will be based mostly on a **combination of final Grade 11 grades and final Grade 12 grades**
 - Qualified applicants will **receive a single, firm offer**
 - Qualified applicants will **receive their offer earlier**, the majority of offers being made in the spring (March)
 - Applicants who receive an offer of admission **must actively accept their offer** by June 1, 2018 – and pay a \$500 tuition deposit – in order to secure their place at the U of A. (If offered after May 1, you will have a later deadline)
 - Application fee is \$125.00 non-refundable
 - Deadline for applying for UofA Scholarships is December 18, 2017.

MACEWAN UNIVERSITY

- ❖ Open House Nov. 4th, will do campus tours by appointment
- ❖ When to Apply
 - Year-round – Deadlines March 30 and June 30 depending on program
 - Applicants can declare first-choice and second-choice programs on a single application
 - Applications are accepted until programs reach their quota
 - Programs with a competitive admission average will now admit based on a competitive admission process

- ❖ Applicants can select up to 2 programs
- ❖ 60 days to get in paperwork after accepted

- ❖ May get conditional acceptance based on previously completed levels of courses
- ❖ If you accept and pay tuition deposit, you can enroll in courses

 - You can apply by PDF form or online beginning October 15th
 - Application fee \$65
- ❖ King's View Fridays - December 1, 2017, January 26, 2018, February 9, 2018, April 6, 2018
 - King's View Friday features a full day of sessions on admissions, financial aid, and student life. You will also have the chance to sit in on classes, tour the campus, and meet with admissions staff, current King's students, and professors. This includes a hot lunch and the option of staying overnight in our student residence.
- ❖ King's Encounter Weekend - November 16 to 18, March 15 to 17
 - Join us on-campus for a full weekend to experience what being a King's student is really like.

APPRENTICESHIP

- ❖ To begin an apprenticeship program, you need to find employment with a journeyman who is willing to train you in your trade. Your employer and the Alberta Apprenticeship Board make arrangements for the six to eight weeks of theory training each year at NAIT or other Technical schools throughout Alberta.
- ❖ The length of time it takes to complete an apprenticeship varies from two to four years depending on the trade.
- ❖ As an apprenticeship, you are an employee, so you earn while you learn. Normally you are paid an hourly wage which increases with your experience in the trade. Depending upon the trade and the period of apprenticeship, your wages will range from 45% to 90% of the current journeyman's wages.

OTHER INSTITUTIONS

- ❖ Alberta
 - A number of other colleges and universities you could consider in Alberta include Alberta College of Art and Design, Augustana Campus (Camrose – U. of A.), Red Deer College, Lakeland College, Olds College, Mount Royal University, Grande Prairie College, Fairview College, Medicine Hat College, Athabasca University, University of Calgary, University of Lethbridge.
- ❖ Canada
 - Calendars and website information from most Canadian universities are available from Student Services.

❖ United States

- Student Services has a list of names, addresses and major areas of study for most American post-secondary institutions. American schools require the results of the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) and/or the ACT (American College Testing) as part of the admission requirement process. Either test may be written at the U of A at scheduled times throughout the year.
- If you are considering an American institution, you should make arrangements to write this test in Grade 11. You should have your application and most of your materials together during your Grade 11 year.

ELK ISLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS FRENCH IMMERSION CERTIFICATE

Elk Island will award a French Immersion Certificate to those students who successfully complete 30 credits in French Immersion, including French Language Arts 30 and one other 30-level French Immersion course. Students who qualify will receive this certificate at our annual awards ceremony.

- Funds are allocated for any accredited post-secondary educational or training program
 - Submit your application when:
 - Your final official high school transcript marks are available, and
 - You are enrolled in full-time post-secondary studies between August 1, 2018 and July 31, 2019
 - You have completed high school on or after September 30, 1980.
 - There is no time limit to apply for this scholarship. Apply only when you have applied to a post-secondary institution.

❖ RAP Scholarship

Students who are in the Registered Apprenticeship Program, who complete at least 250 hours of on-the-job training, and who plan to continue as an apprentice are eligible to apply for \$1000 scholarship. Deadline is June 30.

❖ Institutional Awards

- Most post-secondary institutions have their own set of awards and scholarships. Check the web site or calendar of the institution to which you are applying to make certain that you take advantage of any financial awards available.

Academic Excellence award for students with a final admission average of 90% or higher – between \$1000 and \$7000 (given automatically, no application required)
